We're Hiring...

a Research and Public Engagement Officer: a newly created role enabled by our RareAsOne multi-year funding from the Chan Zuckerberg Initiative (CZI).

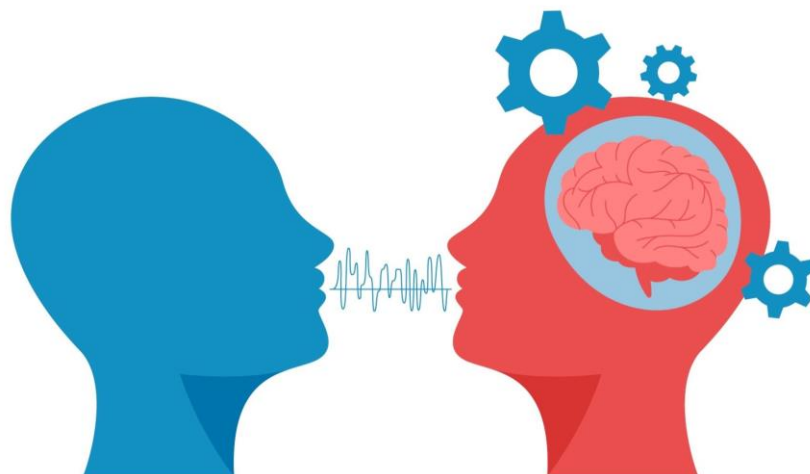
This role will develop and oversee communications and engagement activities focused on Timothy Syndrome and CACNA1C-related Disorders. Key objectives include:

- liaising with the international research community to co-ordinate global research efforts, share knowledge, drive collaboration and accelerate patient-prioritised research.
- engaging with key international stakeholders such as clinicians, researchers, third sector organisations, the CACNA1C community and wider public, to raise the profile of Timothy Syndrome and CACNA1C-related Disorders.
- being responsible for the review of submissions to the imminent TSA's CACNA1C Research Portal.
